well to various color palettes and complements bold furnishings. Plus, its low maintenance requirements make it a practical choice for busy households.

- 5. The Allure of Tiles: Tiles continue to captivate with their versatility and aesthetic appeal. Large-format porcelain and ceramic tiles are in vogue, offering everything from marble-like elegance to artistic geometric patterns. These tiles create eye-catching focal points in both residential and commercial spaces.
